Guidelines For Entry: (Entry is via Entrythingy)

Submissions are open to HRAC members aged 18 and older. 2-D and 3-D will be accepted. Please note: 3-D work will be displayed in cases outside the multi - purpose room. There are no free standing display units.

Up to three pieces can be submitted by each artist.

Upload only one image for each artwork.

All artwork must be the artist's original work and not have been in prior exhibits sponsored by Huron River Art Collective (previously AAWA).

Images must be at least 1000 pixels on the longest side in JPEG/JPG or PNG format.

File size must be greater than 1Mb and no greater than 5Mb.

Art size for 2D: no greater than 6 ft. in either height or width.

Art size for 3D: no greater than 2 ft x 1 ft.

For each artwork submission, a brief description/explanation can be provided about the artwork if the artist so chooses.

Nude images are **not** allowed.

While we prefer your more recent artwork, there are no restrictions on when your art was created.

11) Submitted artwork cannot be work from a class, workshop, or created under instructor supervision.

Delivery – In Person Only, NO SHIPPING

In person delivery to ANN ARBOR DISTRICT LIBRARY on October 3rd, from 10 - 12.

Presentation: Artwork must be in excellent condition, ready for secure installation, and properly labeled before delivery. All work must be framed (exceptions below) and ready for hanging with hooks and a wire. **Sawtooth hangers are not accepted.** Canvases may be framed, wrapped or have painted sides.

Payment Options:

The Fee for entry is \$30.00 for Huron River Art Collective Active Members.

All Entries will be checked against the membership list.

Entries and registration fees are payable thru ENTRYTHINGY

SALES:

The Collective will not be handling sales. All sales transactions will be handled by the artist. Artist information will be available on-site and potential buyers will contact the artist to arrange sales. There is no commission by the Collective. If there is a sale, artist must let the collective know who will be picking up their sold artwork.

By entering your artwork in this exhibit, you are granting permission to the Collective to display your artwork in an online gallery on our website and to use online and in print for promotional purposes of the event.

JUROR:

John Gutoskey

John Gutoskey is an artist, designer, printmaker, & collector living and working in Ann Arbor, Michigan. John earned his BFA in theater design with a minor in sculpture from Webster University in St. Louis. He earned his MFA from the University of Michigan's School of Art & Design where he studied printmaking & installation art, and also completed a certificate in LGBTQ Studies.

Early in his career, John worked as a costume designer and as a specialist in costume crafts, where he worked on productions in New York City and across the US in theater, opera, dance, film, and television. He has taught classes in millinery, mask making, and fabric dyeing at the University of Michigan in the Department of Theater.

John has shown his work across the US, including the Detroit Institute of Art, Grand Rapids Art Museum, Society for Contemporary Craft in Pittsburgh, Indianapolis Art Center, Kinsey Institute, Ella Sharp Museum, and in galleries in Chicago, NYC, Detroit, Toledo, & Ann Arbor. His series of monoprints honoring the victims from the Pulse Nightclub shooting in Orlando, Florida in 2016, "PULSE Nightclub: 49 Elegies", won the prize for Best Juried 2D at Artprize X 2018 and the Alpha Omega Award for Religious Art 2018. John is the owner of JG Studio and the A2 Print Studio in Ann Arbor, Michigan.
